## **Parent Questionnaire**

At the end of this newsletter, there is a breakdown of the responses we received to the parent questionnaire we have been asking you to complete. The feedback was overwhelming positive, however, I am a firm believer that there are always ways in which we can improve and some of the responses certainly give us some ideas about areas for improvement in the future. Thank you to everyone who took the time to respond to this survey. It is something we will aim to do regularly, as your views are very important to the school as we continue to refine and improve aspects of our practice.

#### **Vision and Values**

We have been working with various stakeholders to create a new vision for the school and establish a list of values which pupils will be learning about through assemblies and learning activities. Earlier this week, I sent out a link to a Form asking staff, Governors and parents to select the values they feel are most important out of a longlist of almost 40 values. The aim is to establish a shortlist of 20 values with pupils having the final say on the 12 values they feel are most important. I have been delighted with the response to this request. #### **Children in Need**

As you know, today is the BBC's annual Children in Need fundraising appeal and we are grateful for the donations pupils have brought in so that they could wear their spotty clothes and purchase items from our cake/bake sale. At the time of writing this newsletter, we had raised £239.88 – amazing!

#### **INSET Days**

I sent out a Class Dojo message earlier in the week updating you on our fifth INSET day. An opportunity has arisen to provide professional development for staff on improving oracy skills throughout the school at the start of the spring term. This means that Monday 9<sup>th</sup> January (the first day of the spring term) will now be an INSET day and the school will be closed to pupils.

We have already taken two days of our current allocation of five INSET days. The dates for the remaining three are:

- Monday 9<sup>th</sup> January 2023
- Monday 17<sup>th</sup> April 2023 (Directed Day all schools in Pembrokeshire County Council are closed for the day)
- Monday 24<sup>th</sup> July (staff will be attending twilight sessions throughout the year to make up the time so that they do not need to be in school on this day)

#### **Christmas Performances**

Earlier in the term, I shared with you the dates for the Christmas performances. I can now confirm the times for each performance. We do not know how long each play will last at this point but will provide you with estimated running times once rehearsals are in full swing. Due to the anticipated high demand for these performances, we will initially need to limit ticket sales to just two tickets per pupil for each performance. Once we have a clear idea about how many people will be attending the performances, we may then be able to offer additional tickets on a first-come-first-served basis until we sell out of tickets. More details about prices and how to order tickets will be made available shortly.
