Dear parents/carers,

#### Site Management

Occasionally we are alerted to concerns parents/carers have about how the site is being used. Therefore, I have a few issues I would like to draw your attention to. I would be grateful if you could share this information with anyone else who drops off/collects your child/ren from school who may not have access to Class Dojo and my weekly newsletter.

## 1. Parking at the School Gates

When dropping your child/ren off at school in the morning, please ensure that you do not pull into the space in front of the school gates. Pulling into and parking in this spot, even if it is momentarily, makes gaining access to the main entrance to the school difficult and potentially dangerous, particularly for those arriving to the school by foot.

## 2. Dogs on the School Site

A reminder once again that dogs (unless they are assistance dogs) are not permitted on the school site. This is for the safety and comfort of everyone using the site.

## 3. Smoking On or Near the Premises

Smoking is not permitted anywhere on the school site. This includes smoking in cars parked on the school site. It also includes e-cigarettes. We would be very grateful if parents/carers refrained from smoking close to the school gates/fencing along the front of the school. There is potential that in this instance, smoke could drift onto the school site.

The safety of all users of the school site is of paramount importance and I am sure I can count on everyone's support and cooperation in these matters.

## Harvest Festival

We look forward to welcoming parents and families to share our annual Harvest celebrations with us on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> October at 9.30am. Each class will be performing and the whole school will also sing together. As we did last year, we would like to make a donation of food to PATCH.
