These outstanding performances earned the team a well-deserved place in the semi-finals, where they faced Saundersfoot and delivered a dominant 8–0 victory to progress to the final against Tenby A. The final was a thrilling contest. Sageston struck first, but Tenby quickly responded, making it 2–1 at half time in a tense and closely fought game. In the second half, Sageston truly found their rhythm—controlling play, showcasing some fantastic passing, and demonstrating excellent teamwork throughout. With three more goals added, Sageston secured a superb 5–1 victory at the final whistle!
