Important Messages

Healthy Eating and Drinking

I have asked Mrs Bowers and the Health and Well-being Council to work on creating a revised policy towards healthy eating and drinking in school. By the end of the summer term, they will be ready to present this policy to pupils and parents. In the meantime, I would like to remind parents that the school encourages pupils to bring a **healthy snack** for their breaktime snack – this would usually be a portion of fruit. In addition, we also encourage all pupils to bring a water bottle containing water to help keep them hydrated throughout the day. Please could I ask parents to check these bottles regularly; we are noticing leaking bottles leaving trails of water up the main corridor most mornings. The bottles that are most practical in school are the sports style water bottles that have a pop up/pull up style straw or a nozzle which can be pulled up and pushed back down with ease. Whilst we encourage recycling and, where possible, reusing plastic bottles, we have noticed a number of pupils bringing in 'Prime' bottles. These bottles have become distracting for the pupils and, therefore, we would be grateful if pupils do not bring them to school in the future. In addition, bottles with screw tops are not very practical in busy classrooms.

Pick Up at the End of the Day

To make things easier for teachers dismissing all the pupils from their classes at the end each school day, please could I ask that, as parents, you position yourselves where the class teacher can see you easily. I appreciate some parents may have children being released from two classes at the same time, and I would ask that, if it is practical to do so, that you position yourself centrally on the yard so that both class teachers are able to see you. This will help us to ensure that all pupils are released safely to their adults in a timely manner. A reminder that pupils should be picked up at 3.20pm if they are in Robin and Barn Owl Classes and 3.30pm if they are in Swan and Kingfisher Classes.

Breakfast Club

Please be advised that Mrs Williams stops serving breakfast at 8.30am. If pupils arrive after this point, we will not be in a position to provide them with breakfast. Pupils who arrive after 8.30am will go straight out onto the yard (unless it is raining!) where they will be supervised until the official start of the school day at 8.50am.

During the week, pupils have engaged enthusiastically with a range of a learning activities linked to Wales and our Welsh heritage.

On Thursday 7th March, we will be celebrating World Book Day in school. As always, pupils are encouraged to come to school dressed as a character from a book. They can bring their favourite book to school with them to share during the day. At the end of the day, after we have spent the day in classes engaging in a number of activities related to World Book Day, we will gather in houses and the older pupils will share stories with the younger pupils. In addition, each pupil will receive a book token that can be used to discount the price of any book by £1 during the book fair, which will take place in the final week of term. During the week the book fair is in school, we will have it set up in the lobby and encourage everyone to come and have a look at the books available. All purchases made will help the school as we are given commission to spend on books for the school – the more books purchased, the more we can get for the school.

Robin Class's Landing Day for their Seaside topic will be on Wednesday 20th March. We would be delighted if parents and carers joined us from 10.30am for an hour. During this time pupils will share some of their key learning with parents.
