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# Important Messages

## **Class Dojo**

Please can I remind everyone that staff are unable to pick up and respond to Dojo messages during the day whilst they are teaching. It is highly likely that they will not even see messages until they have finished teaching for the day. In addition, sometimes they are on training or on PPA time and, in these circumstances, may not be able to do anything about the message as they will not be in school. If you need to share an important message, have a general enquiry or are reporting an absence, please phone the school in the first instance to ensure that someone has received your correspondence.

Staff also will not receive messages outside of their normal working hours, when they will have 'quiet hours' activated on their Class Dojo accounts.

## **Staffing**

We were delighted to welcome Mrs Nancy Simes and Miss Emma Barnes to our staffing team at the start of the summer term. They are both working in Robin Class and we hope they will enjoy their time working with the wonderful pupils, families, staff and governors at Sageston CP School.

## **INSET Days – 2024/25**

Next year will start with an INSET day on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> September. This is a designated INSET day meaning that all schools in Pembrokeshire will be closed for staff training. In addition, we have organised a second INSET day on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> September so that we can engage in some professional learning with staff at Tenby Primary School, St Oswald's Primary School and Stepside CP School. This day has been chosen based on the availability of the trainer.

There will be an additional four INSET days throughout the year. We have provisionally set Monday 4<sup>th</sup> November as a whole cluster INSET day where we will be working with colleagues from across the Tenby/Greenhill cluster of schools. Monday 28<sup>th</sup> April 2025 is also a designated INSET day in Pembrokeshire. Monday 21<sup>st</sup> July 2025 will be an INSET day, with staff having engaged in twilight training during the spring and summer terms to make up the time for this day. This will mean that school will finish for the summer holidays on Friday 18<sup>th</sup> July 2025. The sixth and final INSET for the day will be set at a later date and I will inform you of this in due course.

## **School Uniform**

A quick reminder that if pupils wear earrings, they should only be wearing studs not hooped or dangling earrings. They should also not be wearing any other jewellery such as necklaces and bracelets.

## **Pick Up at the End of the Day**

To make things easier for teachers dismissing all the pupils from their classes at the end each school day, please could I ask that, as parents, you position yourselves where the class teacher can see you easily. I appreciate some parents may have children being released from two classes at the same time, and I would ask that, if it is practical to do so, that you position yourself centrally on the yard so that both class teachers are able to see you. This will help us to ensure that all pupils are released safely to their adults in a timely manner. A reminder that pupils should be picked up at 3.20pm if they are in Robin and Barn Owl Classes and 3.30pm if they are in Swan<sup>th</sup> and Kingfisher Classes. After school clubs finish at 4.15pm and we would be grateful if pupils are collected promptly if they are attending a club.

## **Breakfast Club**

The school does not open until 8am for Breakfast Club. Please ensure that any children waiting to come into the school are adequately supervised until staff have opened the doors.

# Outdoor Learning

As you are aware, staff spent last Friday (26<sup>th</sup> April) at Stepside CP School during our INSET Day. We spent the day engaging in some training which was aimed at explaining the significant benefits to pupils of learning outdoors and giving staff ideas for providing effective and enjoyable outdoor learning opportunities with their classes.

## **Outdoor Clothing:**

To make the most of our fantastic grounds throughout the year, from September, we would like for pupils to have the following items in school so that we can go out in any weather:

- Waterproof jacket
- Waterproof trousers
- Wellington boots

These items will need to be kept in school so that we can go outdoors whenever there is a possibility that the learning can be enhanced when it is done outdoors. As always, these items need to be clearly labelled with your child's name.

If you have any of these items that your child has grown out of and you no longer need, we would be very grateful for any donations which we could use to create a bank of 'spare' resources.

For the rest of this term, as we all get used to being outdoors more often, it would be really helpful if your child has at least an old coat and old footwear that they can wear whenever we learn outdoors and which can be kept in school.

## **Grab and Go Boxes:**

We would like to set up some boxes of resources which will support our learning outdoors. We are asking all parents and families to see if they have any of these resources at home or are able to collect them in the coming weeks and send them into school. As you will see, none of these will cost any money.

# School Council News – Health and Wellbeing Council

This week, Lois, Wilson and Olivia from the Health and Wellbeing Council met with the school Governors at their Full Governing Body meeting. Once the policy is finalised and has been approved by Governors, we will share the key parts of it with pupils and parents.

In early March, we celebrated World Book Day on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March – many thanks to you all for supporting the children in dressing up as book characters.

Towards the end of the month, the Scholastic Book Fair was in school. I am grateful to staff and Lois and Betsy from Kingfisher Class for running the fair throughout the week. I hope you all had a chance to visit.

Mrs Jayne Etherington, a resident of Sageston and an educational consultant, visited the school on March 11<sup>th</sup> to introduce the 'My River' project which Swan and Kingfisher Classes are currently engaging with.

On the 21<sup>st</sup> March, we had a visit from Welsh Water. At the same time, pupils from Swan Class were at Greenhill School participating in the First Experiences music concert with pupils from across the cluster.

At the start of the summer term, we had a visit from RNLI lifeguards to teach all of the pupils about water safety, which is especially important as we approach the summer months.
