School Improvement

Priority 3: Strengthen Assessment for Learning approaches, allowing learners to become more reflective and critical about their learning.

This month, I wanted to let you know how we are encouraging pupils to be more reflective and critical about their learning. You might not expect this but we are actually using emojis! After their learning, pupils in all classes are reflecting on how they have felt during their activities and are using a range of emojis to describe their reaction towards it. Through conversations with pupils in each class, I am confident that pupils can also think about how they want to feel in their learning and, if their learning was challenging, what they might need to do in the future to improve it.
